speaking on the Paulist Fathers. We will also be celebrating his 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary as a priest. This column will highlight the history and importance of our Paulist mission. I hope you enjoy reading it over the next few weeks.

### *A Brief History of the Paulist Fathers*

From our very beginnings, the Paulist Fathers have been "different." The Paulist Fathers were founded in 1858 by Fr. Isaac Hecker and four other priests, each a convert to Catholicism. Father Hecker was an intellectual and idealist -- a friend of Henry David Thoreau and Ralph Waldo Emerson. He spent many years searching for a spiritual home before discovering it in the Catholic Church. Hecker firmly believed that America's democratic ideals and respect for individual rights and freedom created the perfect atmosphere in which the Church could grow and thrive.

Pope Pius IX approved Hecker's plan to establish a congregation of priests, and in the spring of 1858, Archbishop Hughes accepted Hecker and his confreres into the New York archdiocese, giving them a parish on 59<sup>th</sup> Street for their headquarters (close to where our mother church is located today).

The Paulists were the first "native" Catholic community of priests founded in North America. Father Hecker's vision was to establish the Catholic Church as a major influence in the lives and values of people throughout the continent. With boundless energy, Hecker traveled thousands of miles, crisscrossing the country to spread the Gospel to largely non-Catholic audiences. He died of leukemia in 1888, but the seeds he planted - a uniquely American, vibrant and optimistic missionary community of priests-has grown into the Paulist Community that you are a part of today.

## ***The Journey to the Christ Child Advent Calendar***



Chris and I created this year's Advent calendar in 2004. We made this fourth calendar so that students may be able to experience a new Advent calendar each year of their study.

Although it is based on the traditional theme of the Nativity, we wanted to focus this Advent calendar on the journey, much like the three wise men made to the Christ Child, and what each of us travels through in preparation for Christmas. Each of us makes our separate journey starting from a different location in our life. For some the journey is easy, but for many of us the journey is difficult, passing through a spiritual desert, or over daily obstacles that seem like mountains. The pattern of the numbered squares is as important to this year's Advent calendar as is the image itself. The numbers zigzag back and forth, making gradual progress to our destination, but never a straight line. When the first number is removed, an abstract image of an angel announces the coming of the Lord. Each day in the first week of Advent, more angels appear until there is a chorus. The star appears and its rays in combination with the spiraling heaven form the *Chi* (X) and *Rho* (P) the first two letters in Greek for the Christ. The one ray points to where we may find the Child, but our path continues to weave back and forth as we pass over mountains and hillsides.

In the second week of Advent, we encounter the wise ones who have seen the star and are making their journey, not knowing where the star may lead them, but trusting in the heavens.

In the third and fourth weeks, not finding the Child in Jerusalem they continue on their search to the tiny town of Bethlehem and beyond. Here we find the shepherds who have heard the angels singing gloriously of the Christ Child.

Finally, on Christmas we find the Holy Family in a cave used as a stable for animals. We, like others who have journeyed far, bare our most precious and unique gift of ourselves, this gift of life that God has given us, to this Child.
