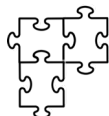

Responding to Our Church in Crisis

We have one smart parish. A couple of parishioners brought to my attention something glaringly missing from last week's bulletin, concerning Bishop Barber's request that we conduct a novena to St. Joseph and that we observed a day of Prayer and Penance on Sept. 14th in response to the scandalous revelations in Pennsylvania and with Archbishop McCarrick.

Prayer is important and essential in this time of crisis. But prayer by itself is lifeless unless we respond to God's call for action – to be



doers of the word and not just listeners. If the Church were only asking for prayers, you are right, that would be offensive given the gravity of the scandal.

Forgive our lack of thoroughness in reporting on our diocese's response to the crisis.

Yes, the bishop asked us to pray, but the diocese is not just praying. I've included in this week's bulletin, an article by the bishop that was in *The Catholic Voice* on September 3. This article gives more information on what the diocese is thinking.

First our bishop calls *evil*, the bishops' cover up of crimes and their abetting in transferring of priest abusers to other parishes. Our bishop clearly recognizes the severity of the crime and is not trying to play the company man softening the crime. He also recognizes that the Church needs reform to fix the gross lack of accountability.

He endorses the call of the president of the US Bishops Conference, Cardinal DiNardo, that Pope Francis establish an independent lay-led review board to address complaints against bishops.

And within our own diocese, he is calling for an independent outside audit of our Diocesan Review Board policies. He intends to ensure that our Diocesan Review Board include lay experts in law enforcement, civil & criminal law, parents, and clinical professionals specializing in treatment of child abuse.

Here at Newman, we will be having an **Open Forum** next Sunday (9/23) after the 10am Mass in the chapel, so members of the Newman Community can share their reactions, feelings, thoughts, and insights concerning the scandal infecting our Church. Everyone is invited to listen and share.

For those wanting more background info, please read the messages from Pope Francis, Cardinal DiNardo, and Bishop Barber. The prayer from James Martin, SJ can be useful to help ground ourselves in this Church quagmire. All these can be found in the info table in the lobby.
